Physical Reality is the concrete, perceivable, physical world.

Socially-constructed Reality is the meaning we collaboratively arrive at through discourse involving everyone; it is context sensitive, applying only to this case, arrived at with these people who provide their unique insight and reason; no voting or consensus is needed, instead, a group of people agrees to describe it this way after hearing all points of view; it evolves over time as insights and experiences change.

Personal Reality is one's own experience, opinions, and judgments.
